



RIDBC Hearing Impairment Services

Across Australia, RIDBC provides specialised services for children and adults of all ages who have hearing loss.

Using a transdisciplinary model, RIDBC works collaboratively to ensure our services are tailored to meet individual needs at all stages of life.

Services include:

- Hearing assessment and audiology services
- SCIC Cochlear Implant Program - covering all stages of cochlear implantation including initial evaluation and assessment, surgery switch-on, re/habilitation and ongoing support
- Individual therapy and education sessions
- Group sessions for children and families
- Seminars and workshops
- Access to a transdisciplinary team, including; speech pathologists, audiologists, ENTs, occupational therapists, psychologists, specialist teachers and a range of other professionals depending on needs
- Bilingual programs offering both Listening and Spoken Language development and Australian Sign Language (Auslan) support
- Education and school support
- Postgraduate and continuing education for teachers and associated professionals.
